Editorial Board Member World Journal of Clinical Cases I would like to thank you for your suggestion to review the paper entitled "POEMS Syndrome with dilated cardiomyopathy: A case report and literature review" for World Journal of Clinical Cases. Comments to authors: In this study, the authors reported Polyneuropathy, organomegaly, endocrinopathy, M-protein, and skin changes (POEMS) syndrome that was associated with dilated cardiomyopathy. The current is very interesting and well-structured. However, some questions need answers based on the following comments: Major correction 1) What was the rationale for taking a bone marrow biopsy??

2) Introduce your abbreviations with complete names for the first time, then use abbs e.g. BNP. 3) POEMS syndrome is a rare paraneoplastic syndrome caused by a plasma cell proliferative disorder, authors are encouraged to do other specific tests for plasma cells e.g detection of specific antibodies for plasma cells using immunohistology, plasma cell collections on haematoxylin and eosin (H&E) stained sections, and detection of the cell-proliferative disorder. 4) The techniques of echocardiography detect fibrosis indirectly, and they are highly dependent on adequate acoustic windows. Nuclear



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imaging techniques, including single-photon emission computed tomography (SPECT) and positron-emission. tomography (PET), can be used for detecting myocardial fibrosis.
