The manuscript is fairly well written and conceptually organized. At times the information was rather basic, but then surgical terminology towards the end was more sophisticated and may need further clarification, especially images. Maybe commit to the broad audience of readers and provide both an overview or circumstanced, and a table comparing more explicitly what is successful in certain types of patients. Just saying in the abstract that treatments should be individualized leaves the reader with no ambition to read on, but rather tells them to essentially do what they think is best. Give the reader incentive and nuanced information so they can make a more educated decision
