COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The authors have presented a case report on Baastrup's Disease: The Kissing Spine which adds to the body of the literature in this "rare" spinous process impingement syndrome. In their discussion the authors reviewed the published literature; however, they did not cover the potential causes of pain such as spinous process fractures that sometime are not clearly apparent with standard x-rays. Pinto et al, reported on two cases in 2004 "Journal of Clinical Imaging 28, (2004) 219-222. In their article they showed two cases of Baastrup both had spinous fractures. I would encourage the authors to include fractures of the spinous process in their discussion.
