However there are, in my opinion, several limitation in this study. 1) In the title is mentioned a systematic review that, in my view was not performed. The authors should go through the literature performing a review of the cases of splenic vein thrombosis after pancreatitis, the sequels of portal vein thrombosis and the treatment. Tables including the paper analyzed, the data suggested and the bibliography should be definitely included as suggested by the guidelines for systematic review. Then the authors can also add the case report. 2) The language can be improved.
