COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

General considerations: This is a very interesting paper showing the successful treatment case for trilobed aneurysm of an azygos anterior cerebral artery. It is well-written and organized. However, this journal contains several issues which have to be clarified. Specific considerations: 1. There are several spelling and grammatical errors, as the words are not separated with comma appropriately. Abstract; sagital should be sagittal. Comma should be placed between embolization and conserving. Introduction; Comma should be placed between case and there. Discussion: Is 0,3 (comma) meaning 0.3 (period) in discussion? 2. The time course of the treatment is not clear. Figure legend in Fig. 1 tells that CT was taken at 1990, however, it is mentioned as 2008 in the text. This is also the case for Fig. 2. 3. There is no explanation for the arrow in Fig. 1 4. Is DACA in Fig. 4 representing pericallosal artery? The figure can be more informative if illustration of the operative view is added.
