SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

In this case report, the Authors discuss an isolated myeloid sarcoma involving the pancreas which is an extremely rare disease that can dispose clinicians to misdiagnosis, especially in the very rare presentation of extra-medullary myeloid leukaemia of the pancreas. This case report describes the difficult and challenging clinical path of a



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36-year old man with myeloid sarcoma occurring in both the pancreas and the orbit. The case report is well described also in term of differential diagnosis above all when, with the progression of the disease, a pancreatic space-occupying lesion developed. Only after a consultation with pathologists, the Authors could improve the investigation by immunohistochemistry, which becomes the key to the diagnosis. As the Author stated in this case, the patient was investigated multiple times in several Centers before the disease was confirmed. The diagnosis was the result of the joint efforts of a teamwork where many specialists such as gastroenterologist, radiologist, and pathologist were working together. Maybe the simultaneous occurrence of lesions in the pancreas and orbit, which is rare, provided guidance for the clinical consideration of related rare diseases. This paper is well discussed and I have no particular further comment on it.

This case report describes a rare presentation of extramedullary myeloid sarcoma that posed difficulty in diagnosis till very late in its clinical course. Patient identity should not be revealed. Patients had been treated at various centers with patchy information available in this report e.g. patient was treated initially as a case of pancreatitis though



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serum amylase was less than three times raised. Similarly, details of lab parameters are not mentioned elsewhere also (page 1 last para). How was the pancreatic biopsy taken: was it trucut or open. Overall it does not maintain a coherent description of the problem. What was the chemotherapy /RT regimen used? Please use standard terminology e.g. contrast enhanced CT scan instead of enhanced CT scan, Endoscopic ultrasound instead of ultrasound gastroscope.
