Comments of this reviewer are: - The authors should explain how this case report adds in the existing literature. As I understand the only novelty is that this is the first case of gemcitabine induced HUS with cardiovascular system involvement at the time of



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diagnosis. So add this in the abstract. - The findings of the urine microscopy should be reported. - "Older literature reviews indicate it is more frequent when the patient is in remission or has minimal tumour burden reference". You forgot the reference - "Subsequent interventions include have also being used such as steroids..." Please edit - "Ustwani et al have reported resolution of the haemolysis and thrombocytopenia in four patients with gemcitabine-induced HUS." Please add after ecolizumab treatment (or move the sentence to the previous paragraph). - Why the authors didn't try other treatments as the patient didn't respond to steroids?
