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report and literature review" was a case report by Yuan-Yuan Zhou, et al. The authors reported a case of Fahr's syndrome due to hypoparathyroidism and reviewed the literature. They concluded that the possibility of hypoparathyroidism should be considered in patients with chronic hypocalcemia, recurrent tetany, and even neuropsychiatric symptoms. Main comments 1. Please define abbreviations before using them. 2. Please use tables to show the results of lab examinations and relevant auxiliary examinations. Please indicate the normal range as well. The current description and the use of arrows were very difficult to follow. 3. Please indicate or discuss whether any treatment of hypoparathyroidism will change the patient's symptoms.
