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This is an interesting case report of successful management of massive fistula bleeding during EUS-guided pancreatic pseudocyst drainage using hemostatic forceps within the fistula, which proved the efficiency of this method. Bleeding is one of the main EUS procedure-related complications. Although the incidence is low, it's difficult to manage and often requires surgery or radiologic-guided embolization. This case is very interesting and very rare, the case is well summarized. Minor comments: 1. The history of the disease should be added. 2. Are there any laboratory examines? If so, please add the data and make a short discussion about it. 3. Anyway, this case is very interesting. I suggest to accept is for publication after a minor revision.
