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SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The review is very well written and the topic explored is timely relevant. The authors organized very well a sequence of available knowledge to draw their final recommendations regarding prioritization of cancer treatment and ICU admission of cancer patients during the COVID-19 pandemic. The article has potential to be useful to hospital teams and oncologic services. The only two fragments where I recommend revision are: 1) The last paragraph of A(H1N1), since the list of three considerations are disconnected; and 2) I believe that the future "will" in the last line of the first paragraph about SARS-CoV-2 pandemic should be substituted by a present tense.
