Concretely, I would like to make another section covering diagnosis of gastrointestinal manifestations related to COVID-19 and its implications in infection control of the SARS-CoV2. As you know, most of gastrointestinal manifestations are non-specific to COVID-19, which is making a detection of the infection quite difficult in clinical practice and infection control, as covered in the following article.
