Line 40- At present, there is no accepted treatment standard for this disease, and conservative treatment is usually the first choice this kind of patient. - Can you please add a reference for this. Line 80- He felt that the cervical pain was significantly relieved after his cervical spine was immobilized. - Can be re-worded as patient reported significant relief in his neck pain after the cervical spine was immobilized.
