The authors should summarize how to diagnose paroxysmal nocturnal hemoglobinuria-induced hemolysis and important decisive factor. The last sentence of the conclusion is recommended, although hemolysis should be suspected if bilirubin elevation inconsistent with other findings is found after hepatectomy.
