I found the manuscript entitled "Effect of Yiqi Jianpi Anti-Cancer Prescription Combined with Chemotherapy on Patients with Colorectal Cancer after Operation" original, very interesting, well-structured and with huge impact on real life practice. The incidence of colorectal cancer ranks third and its mortality ranks second worldwide. However, studies have reported that most of patients might have local recurrence or metastasis within 2 years after surgery, and this clinical problem needs to be solved with urgency.
