This paper showed the comprehensive treatment of maxillary fibrous dysplasia with orthodontic treatment. The paper are well written, but some parts should be revised. 1. Was the biopsy performed after surgical recontouring of the dysplastic area before the beginning of orthodontic treatment? How did the authors decide to start timing of the tooth movement? 2. Authors said they avoided using TAD for tooth intrusion to prevent any trigger for reactivation of the lesion. The discussion should be included with proper reference.
