This case report describes a patient with lateral thigh pain caused by an obturator hernia. It describes the clinical course and the basis for diagnosis in detail, but I have the following concerns: 1) Did this patient have any obturator nerve irritation symptoms, such as pain extending from the medial thigh to the lower extremity or abnormal sensation? 2) Regarding the mechanism of lateral femoral pain, it is necessary to consider why it occurred in an area different from the site of obturator nerve innervation.
