### COMMENTS TO AUTHORS:

In this manuscript the author describes a case with autoimmune hepatitis, who developed a fever lasting several weeks. After excluding other etiologies which could cause fever the patients was diagnosed as azathioprine-induced fever, confirmed with rechallenge test. The diagnosis was definite and indeed this case looks interesting, while the reviewer would like to address several problems as follows. 1. Introduction: “fever as a sole symptom ... in about 3-5%” 3-5% of what? 2. The diagnosis of AIH should be confirmed with presenting lab data, including CBC, liver enzymes, titer of autoantibodies (ANA, ASMA) as a table. 3. The daily dose of warfarin was 22.5mg – is it correct? 4. Also the lab data when she presented with long-lasting fever should be demonstrated as a table. 5. “autoimmune serology were negative” – I don’t understand this, because when the diagnosis of AIH was made ANA and anti-DNA were positive. Did these autoantibodies turned to be negative, you mean? 6. “With the patient informed consent” – Did the ethical committee in the facility allow to do rechallenge test? 7. Acknowledgements – You thank what?? Above all, there are too many typos, unnecessary capitalizations, and grammatical errors in the draft, which suggest that the authors might not be serious in writing and thus greatly reduce the quality of the manuscript. The authors should carefully examine the manuscript and should intensively revise it, with the assistance of native speakers.
