I have some min?r concerns: At page 3 "human cancer types (reviewed in ref[12,13])" should be corrected as "human cancer types [12,13]) At page 4 invasive adenocarcinoma (reviewed in [4],[19]; Figure 1). Should be corrected as "invasive adenocarcinoma (Figure 1)[[4],[19]. Please prefer to use "e.g." or "i.e" throughout the text, not both of them. At page 5, "glioblastoma multiforme in 2008[23] (Table 3)." Should be corrected as "glioblastoma multiforme in 2008 (Table 3)[23]. " "microsatellite instability (MSI") abbrevation was given at page 5, but there is replication at page 8. It should be given at just where it was just mentioned. The reference numbers should be given after first author's names. (i.e. Kim et al. [72]) Reference style should be corrected according to journal style. There should be a list of abbrevations.
