The manuscript is well written and seems to be valuable for the publication in WJG, although extensive English polishing and editing is needed. Minor comments: 1. Page 1, line 1. Carcinoma moderate and bad should be carcinoma with moderate to poor. 8. Figure 4. Legend. One the two patients with adenocarcinoma should be one of the two patients with adenocarcinoma.
