Thank you for submitting your case report to the WJG. It seems like this is a unique complication of NF-1. The discussion is interesting and well thought out. However, the manuscript does need English language revision and some changes in terminology and writing style. For example, ileus should be obstruction. Try to shorten the manuscript overall. Case reports should be 2-3 pages maximum. Tables and figures are helpful. Specific comments/suggestions: - I think the title should be: Small bowel volvulus as a complication of von Recklinghausens disease: a case report. - ABSTRACT: - no abbreviations in the abstract please. - delete "herein". - change "affected by" to "with". - spell percentage unless it is in a parenthesis. - Change to "...who presented with clinical findings of an acute abdomen". - Change to "...Computerized tomography showed a volvulus of the terminal ileum with mesenteric swirling". - change "needed to be" to "was".
