COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The authors present a surgical resected case of adrenal cystic lymphangioma. Although this is a rare tumor which is worthy of medical case report, many points should be revised before publication.

1. Much of English grammar is clumsy, and too many spell mistakes and inappropriate abbreviations exist in this manuscript. The manuscript should be revised by an English language editor.
2. The title is "Adrenal cystic lymphangioma masquerading mucinous cystic neoplasm of the pancreas", however, authors describe "Radiologic impression ruled out pancreatic mucinous cystic neoplasm, pseudocyst and omental cyst." in the abstract and "Radiologist ruled out pancreatic mucinous cystic neoplasm or pseudocyst" in the main body. Which is correct? What was preoperative diagnosis of this cystic tumor?
3. In the abdominal contrast enhanced CT (Fig.2A), the low density cystic mass is located in the retropancreatic space (behind the pancreas body-tail and splenic artery). This finding is very uncommon for pancreatic cystic tumors. MRI images (Fig.3) also cannot indicate connection between the cystic tumor and the pancreas.
4. Authors commented "adrenal cystic lymphangioma masquerading cystic neoplasm of the pancreas is nearly the first case", however, I think this is not quite useful message for readers.
5. Authors should describe surgical detail of laparoscopic tumor resection. How many trocars were inserted in the abdomen? How do you extract this huge cystic mass? If you extracted the tumor after aspiration of the fluid content, don't you worry about malignant potential of this tumor and risk of dissemination?

A bit confusing as to the title"masquerading mucinous cystic neoplasm of pancreas". In the initial write up, it is mentioned that the radiologist ruled out a mucinous cystic neoplasm of pancreas. Later in the discussion it is mentioned that it appeared to originate from the pancreas". Not clear if it was a clinical examination that raised the suspicion that it was cystic neoplasm of the pancreas. Not sure if that is clearly addressed there. Nevertheless, adrenal lymphangioma is rare.
