## COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The authors present two cases of a modified surgical technique for the treatment of non-malignant pancreatic diseases. As a non-surgical specialist, I have only general comments on style and presentation. The authors fail to adequately explain how their procedure differs from common practice (by contrasting it to other reported cases, for example). The manuscript is riddled with orthographical and grammatical errors. A native English speaker should review the manuscript. The style is confusing and the surgical procedure is hard to follow in the text. Step by step images and procedure explanations could be useful. The text is quite repetitive at times.
