COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The article "Advances in treatment of ulcerative colitis by herbs: from bench to bedside" is a fairly good review of the current state of things in alternative treatment of UC, particularly on the usage of herbal medicine. The article showed a great deal of information on the different herbal substances used in treatment of UC. But the article lacks some in depth reasoning and shows very little of the author's opinion or understanding of the matter at hand, instead it feels more like the compiling of research data. Perhaps the authors could talk about their thoughts at length in the last part of manuscript. Another weak point in this manuscript is the language, the authors need to polish up their sentences and look more closely on grammar issues. For example, "owning" is the derivative of "own", in the context of your abstract, you'll want to use "owing". And there is no such thing as "threatening the life quality" of patients, "lowering" would be more appropriate. In page 5 of the manuscript, you wrote "it is evidenced that the nuclear factor kappa B", surely you realize that "evidence" should never be used as a verb? Besides these minor mishaps, the article is of fairly good quality, please make the revisions as suggested. Good luck on your future research.

In this review, recently and potential effectiveness of herbs has been evaluated for the treatment of Ulcerative Colitis. Analized herbs include: aloe vera gel, butyrate, tormentil extracts, wheat grass juice, and curcumin. The structure of the review is not complete. A proper assessment of the studies would provide to follow the PRISMA statement for systematic reviews[1]. In addition, several drugs analyzed include different operating principles.
