Please report the demographic characteristic of the population that live in the zone of the hospital (resident, foreign origin, men/women, etc.), and if is possible with a map of the region. - In the introduction section, is necessary to report that now, the diagnosis of celiac disease, is often made not for gastrointestinal disease in first line, but because the patients can presented other diseases [i.e. affective and psichiatric disorders (Addolorato et al. Dig Dis 2008), skin diseases (Abenavoli World J Gastroenterol 2006), endocrine disorders (Robazzi et al. Clin Exp Rheumatol]. - The patients made a structural interview. However, no information about the diet of this health subjects are reported. - Is necessary to improve the conclusion, with the discussion of the possible impact of the data reported in this paper on regard of the health policy in UAE. - Many double spaces are present in the text. - Please revise the References section an table 3, in order to present appropriately it.
