Pancreatic ectopia is relatively rare. Here the authors reported a case of ectopic pancreatic tissue on the epithelial layer of the gastric mucosa, which was first reported, according to the authors. Therefore, it is of clinical significance for clinicians when dealing with submucosal or polyp-like gastric lesions. However, there are quite a lot of grammar errors need to be revised. For example: 1. In Summary, "The case regards 73 years old woman---" shoule be "The case regards a 73 years old woman---" 2. In Introduction, "It may be fund at different sites in the gastrointestinal tract ---" shoule be "It may be found at different sites in the gastrointestinal tract ---" 3. In Case report, "--- with the remarkable aggravation a few days before admitting to the hospital" shoule be "--- with the remarkable aggravation a few days before being admitted to the hospital" 4. Please spell out the full name of the abbreviation "GERD" and "GIT" when they appear first time.

COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

In this manuscript, the authors reported a case of Pancreatic ectopia in the gastric cardia, which is a relatively rare lesion and hard to accurately diagnose. It is very useful for clinicians to learn this disease. However, there are still some points need to be improved: The full spelling of "GERD" and "GIT" need to be added when they appear first time in the text. Some spelling errors need to be corrected. E.g. in Introduction section, "Although, heterotropic pancreas---" should be "Although, heterotopic pancreas---". In Discussion section, "73% in subucosal layer---" should be "73% in submucosal layer---". "Last but not least, pancreatic ectopia may occasionally turn to adonocarcinoma---" should be "Last but not least, pancreatic ectopia may occasionally turn to adenocarcinoma---". The Figure should be marked with some labels to help the readers to know the location of the targeted lesions. It would be better if the authors could add some information including pathologic images, etc. More data is more useful and more interesting for readers.
