COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

General comments: This is a very interesting manuscript that contains important data in a subject where data is still sparse. The manuscript is well written apart from few comments regarding abbreviations and references. Most of the techniques and volumes used in introducing endoluminal agents apply to adults or older children, no special volumes per kilogram were mentioned for young children or infants. Authors have to specify the suitable ages for different techniques and if there is a consensus on techniques and volumes in younger ages. The authors did not mention if any of the techniques used in children need anaesthesia or they can only be applied to a co-operative older child; this needs to be clarified together with the age limits to which these techniques can be applied. Keywords: "colitis ulcerosa" change to: "ulcerative colitis" Abbreviation rules have to be followed, first appearance in the manuscript: details followed by abbreviation between brackets, then the abbreviation is to be used hence forward. Unify: enteroclysis or enteroclysis In first paragraph of "Differential Diagnosis: coagulation change to "coagulation" Its just helpful, change to: "It is just helpful" References: Revision to follow the Instruction to authors.
