In this retrospective study, the authors evaluated the feasibility, safety, and efficacy of the modified laparoscopic pancreaticoduodenectomy. Some revisions are needed. 1 The structure of main text is not so clear. Methods and results section is confused. The authors should make those two sections more clear, and not mixing them together. 2 The discussion is clear, and very well. 3 Some language polishing should be revised. 4 Too more figures, some of them can be deleted. Please check them carefully. 5 References are updating.
