The structure of the paper is a bit misleading: chapters on "Case report" and "Comments" are partially repeating each other. There are no details provided about the treatment of GERD neither about associated diseases/treatments and diets- all these may be important in describing belching. The references in Chinese are not helpful for international readership, these should be replaced by international ones. There are 2 papers of importance while discussing the topic: Gislason T et al 2002 and Leal R et al 2014- so please analyse the case in the frame of evidence from literature more broadly. The language needs editing.
