The only highlight of this manuscripts is the multiple of their case. The language is fair. 1.What is the advantage of TEM over other endoscopic techniques such as ESD or EMR-C in treatment of carcinoids smaller than 1cm considering the location, number, size of carcinoids? This should be emphasized. 2.The author said they kept free margins of 1 cm when resecting tumors, what is the evidence of the safe margin of 1 CM? 3.What is the difference between multiple rectal carcinoids and solitary carcinoid?

This case report is interesting and well presented. I only have few comments/requests: - minor language revision to be done - the Authors mention the role of TRUS in the discussion as follow: " we routinely perform the transrectal ultrasound (TRUS) to assess the depth of tumor invasion and preclude lymph node metastasis" This sentence is misleading as TRUS is not the method of choice to exclude lymph nodes involvement. This should be clarified. - how was a safe margin of 1 cm guaranteed?
