Thank you to invite me to review this manuscript. The manuscript reports two cases of periampullary mixed adenoneuroendocrine carcinoma, treated in China. Six authors are listed. These lesions are rare. Furthermore, there is no specificities compelling to change the management prior surgery and final histopathological examination. The overall quality of english, the editing, the interest of the cases are poor. The review is not exhaustive and mainly related to histopathology. The treatment is not rationally discussed (Why a pancreaticoduodenectomy ? Why somatostatin ? Is the neuroendocrine component the most aggressive ?) Conclusions are irrelevant: the lesion is rare, symptoms are not specific(How should we pay more attention on the early diagnosis ? Why would it improve the prognosis?). Consequently, I do not recommend this paper to the editor for publication in World Journal of Gastroenterology.
