1) The liver transplantation in children is long-term survival over 10 years, more children experienced the transfer from pediatric to adult health services. it have many problems about psychological and social aspects, as well as quality of life and non-adherence. 2) The retrospective study aimed at evaluating the perceptions of adult and adolescent patients and parents for transition-programs and done transition by analysing responses of pre-transfer adolescents, their parents and post-transfer adults from their pediatric-liver-transplant-cohort using a self-designed questionnaire . The study indicated that this underlines the need and potential importance of such programs and the usefulness of adult patient mentoring. transition programs need to be developed in close collaboration with adolescents, but perhaps presented in such a way that the adolescents are designing their individual transition versus partaking of a pre-assigned journey. 3) The retrospective study is important guidance to design and work out the transition programs for liver transplant center in children. But it need to be further improved and collaborations in multiple transplant centers.
