Differentiation between pancreatitis and PDAC still be difficult ,author discussed the relationship between acute or chronic pancreatitis and pancreatic cancer, explain the causality and diagnostic methods of AP,CP and PDAC. A systematic document retrieval in this field was conducted to review and explain the relationship from the perspectives of background, clinical case, the relationship between AP,CP and PDAC and how to differentiate (imaging and biomarkers). Minor revision: 1 the author present the educational case , however we can not conclude the tail of pancreatic cancer on MR was originated from the first time onset of AP, is any similar or different imaging finding on the tail of pancreas.the first time onset is on the head of pancreas, but the second time is on the tail of pancreas. Does the tumor was exist on the onset of first time? 2The references need to be updated, only 17 of 49 references were published in the last 5 years, which made the current value of this review doubtful.
