This is a rare, interesting, well-written and illustrated case report that deserves to be published. It discusses a rare manifestation of the MEITL with gastrointestinal bleeding and emphasizes the importance of early diagnostics and treatment. The literature search of similar cases is also established. However, the case report could be improved with some corrections. • What was the first instrumental examination you performed: EGD or CT? According to the abstract, it looks like EGDS, however the case presentation part Imaging examinations you started with CT. • Please provide the abbreviation's explanation under table 1 and the normal ranges of your laboratory. Minor language polishing needed: several commas and articles missing.
