Abstract and introduction should include your aim of presenting this case. 3- You notice that "gastric metastasis from lung cancer is associated with dismal outcomes". It should give more information about outcome gastric/gastrointestinal metastasis of lung carcinomas (survival time, survival rate, mortal rate, etc.) in discussion. 4- English used in this manuscript should be made better. 5- New document is uploaded with some corrections.
