Dear Authors, I suggest to address the following concerns: 1. How the authors have recorded information about alcohol use and physical activity? Directly in gms/d and METs/WK in the questionnaire? I wondered if the questionnaire not used for Dietary details was validated. 2. In the Discussion the authors affirm that coffee and tea consumption were not significantly associated with colorectal cancer. It could be useful to report these values in the table. In addition, they should add which are the other studies where tea consumption is not associated with colorectal cancer (Line 39 of the Discussion paragraph). 3. Please correct the CI in Table 3 for Mutton consumption of more than 2-3 times a week and the OR reported for Fried food in the Discussion paragraph to be consistent with the value of Table 3. 4. Please decide in the text as well as in the tables, how many decimal numbers would you use.
