This is in fact a particularly good and interesting review, easy to read, very well documented, which shows the evolution since the very beginning of this new type of endoscopic procedure. However, I miss in some way a certain critical view of these different breakthrough procedures, having in mind what happened before with the endoscopic treatment of the second space NOTES. For this reason, it would be interesting the author adds some critic view when it concerns to the comparative results with others endoscopic techniques or standard surgical treatment, and some comments about the learning curve of these procedures and the applicability in the clinical practice, in many cases much related with the level of local surgical expertise and patient preference than with the technique itself Page 6 the bibliographic reference number 11 appears before the reference number 10, correct, please The authors stated on page 3 that "...Using the principles of endoscopic submucosal dissection (ESD), the submucosal space or "third space" was accessed and used as a working plane while the mucosal flap prevented any peritoneal leakage [5].....The technique was then refined and perfected by Inoue, who performed the ". For instance when they described the different procedures of endoscopic of third space, they should begin describing ESD Table 1 and discussion. Many subepithelial lesions (SMT) are currently treated by ESD as the authors stated last paragraph page 7., Therefore when it comes to STER the authors should state the importance of USE for diagnosis of lesion coming out of the muscularis propia. Besides it is possible STER could replace in the future ESD, so the authors should compare both in terms of the time of the procedure, complications, rate of relapse and possible difficulties and problems with the learning curve
