But I have some suggestions for the author to improve the paper further. 1.The Abstract can be more informative, such as a brief description of the ten existing technologies in general. 2.The authors stated that the paper is a critical analysis of current endoscopic release techniques, but there does not seem to be much of the authors' critical attitudes to the specific advantages and disadvantages of each technique. If possible, please provide a table briefly illustrating the advantages and disadvantages of techniques mentioned in the article. 3.How does the author guarantee that all current published studies have been reviewed. The attachment should provide the search strategy to use. 4.In the DISCUSSION section, the authors can provide a speculative view of how research on the Endoscopic release technique will develop in the coming years, and any improvements or research that may occur.
