Dear author Your paper is interesting however I have some remarks: - I propose changing the title to: " management of gastric neoplasms: A review of the recent advances in endoscopy " - This review summarizes the type of gastric lesion and not just the recent advances in their endoscopic management - Can you add how you did this review? did you have any inclusion criteria for the articles? - The figures were not mentioned in the main text, you must add it - Pay attention to abbreviation, you have to put the details at the first appearance (from the introduction) - After the introduction, I suggest adding this title: diagnosis of the main gastric lesions - Adding EUS pictures will improve the quality of your manuscript - In the chapter of EUS: you have to add that this examination is indicated for suspicious lesion without a diagnosis by conventional biopsy - Many references are published before 2015!!
