Dr. Amornyotin S described a very well written review on sedation for gastrointestinal endoscopic (GIE) procedures. In this paper, the author covered the main points of a state-of-art lecture about sedation in GIE procedures such as definition of levels and indications of sedation, ASA classification and aspects of medications used in sedation for GIE procedures. According to the title, the main aim of the paper was provide a discussion in a controversial theme among endoscopists: the use of registered nurses for administration of sedation in GIE procedures. However, the role of nurses in sedation of GIE procedures was discussed only in few paragraphs of this paper (pages 14 and 16).
