This manuscript is very interesting and well written. However, I feel there are some problems in this article. (1) In Discussion, author should indicate an approximate patient number of amebic liver in India. (2) Author should change "13.7 * 7.5 cm " to "13.7 x 7.5 cm " in Page 2, and "2 * 2 cm" to "2 x 2 cm", "12.8*8.6*3.4 cm" to "12.8 x 8.6 x 3.4 cm" in Page 3. (3) Author should add the arrows which indicate air pocket in Figure 2.
