Reference 18 should be updated with the newer BSG and ESGE guidelines that have very recently been published on this topic: Veitch AM, Vanbiervliet G, Gershlick AH, Boustiere C, Baglin TP, Smith LA, Radaelli F, Knight E, Gralnek IM, Hassan C, Dumonceau JM.
