These two important issues may also be important in therapeutic modalities. 3. There are some grammar or spelling mistakes like; a) Introduction 2nd sentence is missing. b) Page 7, line 20; coffee should be written with lower case. c) Page 19, line 22; authors should replace "improves" by "improve". d) Page 13; "carnitin" should be replaced by "carnitine". COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This is a detailed review on the significance of dietary supplements in the treatment of NAFLD. Comments 1. The Introduction needs extensive revision. NAFLD definition, clinical details and current diagnostic methods need revision according to recent published guidelines (i.e. ref. 22) 2. References on epidemiology and pathogenesis of NAFLD should be updated 3. English needs particular attention in several, but not all, sections of the manuscript, including the introduction. 4. The second sentence of the Introduction and the paragraph on curcumin appear unfinished. 5. Reference 75 is not used in the right context. 6. Reference style should conform to journal guidelines. No authors are listed in reference 20
