The manuscript "Screening and prophylaxis for infectious diseases prior to biological therapy in inflammatory bowel diseases (IBD) patients: what we know and what we would like to know" by Andrisani G. et al attempt to systemize the current knowledge of screening and prevention for infectious diseases prior the initiation biological treatment in patients with IBD. However, several amendments could be considered. The authors should clearly state if all IBD patients prior biological therapy should be screened for all mentioned in the review pathogens or are there any mandatory and optional ways of screening. There is lack of information about risk factors among IBD patients for mentioned pathogens, the weakness of several diagnostic tools in patients on immunosuppressive therapy and alterations in response to vaccination in IBD patients. The great facilitation would be to present core tips about available diagnostics and prevention strategies for all mentioned infectious disease prior biological therapy in the table and to point out queries. The references should be shortened. The authors should precisely select the most important publications.
