This manuscript would be improved by: 1. A better Figure 1A that depicts both the choledochocoele and pancreas divisum. 2. Why choledochocoeles occur and why there is likely no relationship to pancreas divisum which develops at 4-6 weeks embryologically. 3. Why the authors attribute pain to this tiny choledochocoele as opposed to the pancreas divisum or gastritis/GERD/irritable bowel, etc. Note suggestions for grammar improvement: 1. Introduction = Choledochocoele is a rare...which may result in a delay in diagnosis. 2. Case report, line 2 = Epigastric pain (epigastralgia not in common use in English). 3. Discussion, paragraph 1, line 8 = cholangiography 4. Discussion, paragraph 2, line 1 = A choledochocoele has been classified 5. Discussion, paragraph 2, line 6 = A choledochocoele
