As a reviewer my suggestions to the author are: 1- Please complete the title to illustrate the type/direction of fracture in root. As you better know "Fractured roots" is a general term including vertical or horizontal root fractures, while the cases are Horizontal root fractures. 2- case report 1, Line 5: What do you mean by "What concerns coloration"? (highlighted) 3- case report 1, Line 12: please explain more about "cicatrical fibrosis" and differential diagnosis with PA lesions in discussion part. 4-Discussion, line 4: the recommended splinting time for Horizontal root fracture is much longer in IADT guidelines and Dental Trauma guide (4 weeks up to 4 months). please add these credible references to the manuscript and double check the splinting time recommended by references 5,6,7!!! Because 7-10 days are quite short time for splinting a root fractured root. 5-It's better to add some references, which describe the outcome for those root-fractured teeth, underwent orthodontic treatment. Because it is very important to know how to move a fractured root.
