The Authors presenta an editorial about the history of takotsubo syndrome and future prospects. I agree with authors that further research is needed to clarify the pathophysiology to help guide clinical decision-making and development of novel therapeutic strategies for those at risk of mortality, acute complications or chronic



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cardiac symptoms. Current knowledge may help for precise diagnosis of TTS and to optimize clinical management during both the acute and chronic phase. However, large-scale randomized controlled trials are needed to obtain more robust evidence for optimal treatment of TTS. In parallel with these clinical approaches, it is necessary to clarify the exact pathophysiology, which can rapidly facilitatesystematic management strategies for TTS.
