They also need to check carefully on the references, for example, last paragraph on page 31, reference 189 is not correct for "Transient, repeated episodes of ischemia when applied to an organ distant from the heart have been shown to reduce infarct size". If the authors address the above issues, the manuscript should be ready to publish.
