Abstract: Aim: this part seems to me "Background" and not aim, because I cannot find any aim in the statements. 2. Introduction: it is really too long and, in some parts, difficult to follow: I suggest to condense it. 3. Methods: I suggest to add information about the period (from when....and the last revision) of time of the articles analysed. 4. Conclusion: Generally, conclusion is a final message drawn by the authors and references should be avoided. Moreover, I suggest to add some practical advices for the readers.
