The associated sections can thus expand. The primary prevention of AN is also critical in the aspect of public health and may need some wording in the section of aetiology or an independent one. 2. The section of Lab tests are too wording and may need shortening. All lab tests in the practice are serving the diagnosis, prognosis and treatment of patients. This section thus can be merged into the part of the differential diagnosis, prognosis and treatment. 3. What do the authors think about the MDT model in the treatment of AN?
