The topic of this work is interesting. PPD not only affects the psychological and physiological aspects of maternal health, but can also affect neonatal growth and development. By exploring the support relationship of PPD with partners and its influencing factors, the authors found that the main factors affecting PPD during breastfeeding were marital harmony, newborn health, stress communication, mutual support, negative support, co-support, and total score of partner support. This finding could enable hospitals and related departments to pay attention to the level of maternal PPD, guide them to correctly understand and understand the disease, carry out targeted individualized nursing intervention for patients and their partners, improve the support level of their partners, and improve the mental health of maternal PPD. The study is well designed and presented with optimal analysis, discussion, tables and figures display of data. Thank you for giving opportunity to review this study. However, the following points must be considered before publication. 1. According to Table 1, the content of the General information questionnaire in the text should also include Mode of delivery; 2. In the section of Statistical analysis, "Pearson's correlation analysis... PPD and Dyadic



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Coping Inventory (DCI)" is proposed to be deleted or placed in the RESULTS. 3. In the first part of the results, the description of "The PPD scores of lactating women with marital harmony and neonatal health were compared (P<0.05)" was incomplete. In addition, the EPDS is presented in Table 2. Is the PPD score here wrong? Please confirm.
